#### 1.2 OUR OBJECTIVES



Promoting sustainable growth and enhancing the quality of life in underserved communities in Sri Lanka. Providing essential educational resources and school equipment for underprivileged children.

Offering a diverse range of training programs, including vocational training for practical skill development, as well as specialized fine arts education in dance, Miruthangam, violin, and other musical instruments Improving children's access to nutritious food through initiatives like the 'Breakfast for Kids' program.

Assisting children with terminal illnesses and those with special needs.

Facilitating economic selfreliance through livelihood projects, particularly for women-led families.

Providing tailored assistance to individuals with disabilities, which includes therapy classes, sensory room activities, and specialised counselling sessions for their parents. Implementing infrastructure improvement projects like roof replacement in the hill country.

Actively working on environmental sustainability by enhancing infrastructure in rural areas, with a special focus on providing access to clean water for village communities. Offering immediate and effective relief to communities affected by seasonal monsoon floods and frequent landslides, particularly in the hill country regions. Our efforts focus on providing timely assistance to ensure rapid recovery and support during these recurring natural disasters.



### 2. Look back to Our 2023 Achievements

#### 2.1 KEY ACHIEVEMENTS



Care in the Community

Elderly Nutritional Support: Our bi-monthly dry food program successfully reached 245 elders, enhancing their nutrition and overall well-being, particularly for those facing age-related challenges and isolation.

Breakfast for Kids Initiative: We provided nutritious breakfasts to 155 young children in pre-schools, significantly contributing to their health and early development, ensuring a strong foundation for their future growth.

Entrepreneurial Empowerment: By supporting the startup of 36 businesses led by women and individuals with disabilities, we provided economic independence and selfesteem, underscoring the resilience and potential within our community.









#### **Enabling Diverse Abilities**

In 2023, we enhanced our special needs program by partnering with local hospitals and expanding therapy options for the 48 children we serve. This tailored approach has visibly boosted their development and well-being, showcasing our dedication to promoting their potential in a nurturing environment.

#### Culture, Sports & Mindfulness

In 2023, our two fine arts centres have notably excelled, with performances now captivating public audiences. The teaching quality has significantly improved, leading to our students receiving 6 national awards/medals for their performances. Serving over 130 children, these centres have become pivotal in promoting artistic skills and cultural appreciation.

This year, our yoga and mindfulness sessions, along with our counselling program at local schools, positively impacted over 400 students. These activities have helped create a supportive and nurturing environment, contributing to the overall well-being and development of young minds in the community. The positive outcome highlights the significant role these programs play in promoting holistic wellness.

In 2023, our karate program, running in two centres, saw over 150 students engage in training, yielding very pleasing results. Highlighting our success, two students achieved national recognition by winning gold medals, and another two earned bronze medals in a yearly national competition. This outstanding performance underlines the strength and effectiveness of our karate training, making it a year of notable achievements in martial arts.










#### 2.1 KEY FINANCIAL INFORMATION

### Every £1 you donate will be put to great use in 2024 to help the most needy and vulnerable. Below are some examples on how every £1 helps.

1. Breakfast for Children

Five years ago, Serendip Children's Home initiated the Breakfast Project to guarantee daily breakfast for vulnerable children in North Sri Lanka's rural areas. Currently, we're providing this essential morning meal to over 150 pre-schoolers. Remarkably, it costs only £1 per week to feed one child, making your support incredibly impactful.

• Feeding 1 child costs £48 per year.



#### 2. Assisting Special Needs Children

In 2023, Serendip Children's Home broadened its impact, offering specialized therapies at our centers and collaborating with local hospitals. Our services now include sensory rooms, speech therapy, yoga, and arts therapies, enhancing the support for children with special needs and autism in our community.

• A speech therapist costs £180 per month, totalling £2,100 per annum.

#### 3. Provisions for Elders Project

Our Elders Project in Northern Sri Lanka is a heartfelt initiative, bringing essential bi-monthly food rations to the most vulnerable elders across five districts. This effort is more than just providing meals; it's about ensuring our elders feel valued and supported in their community.

#### How You Can Help:

- With just £8, you can provide a month's worth of nourishing food for one elderly person.
- A commitment of £96 covers a full year's sustenance for an elder, ensuring they have consistent, reliable access to food.

Your support plays a crucial role in maintaining this lifeline, directly enhancing the quality of life for our respected elders.
